The average life cycle of a church is 70 years.

Birth/Growth Cycle:

- Vision
- Structure
- Clarifying
- Leadership
- Maturity

Plateau/Maintenance

Decline/Death Cycle:

- Nostalgia
- Questioning
- Control
- Polarization
- Blaming
- Leaving

It is natural for a church in the decline cycle to attempt to reclaim their glory days by trying to work their way back through the cycle. That is not possible.

Instead, the church must recapture their original (or a new) vision and go through a rebirthing process.		

Spiritual Resurrection: 2 Elements

1. Rediscovery of original mission

Rev 2:4-5

- 4 Nevertheless I have this against you, that you have left your first love.
- 5 Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly and remove your lampstand from its place-- unless you repent.
- 2. Making the Gospel relevant for our time

1 Cor 9:22

To the weak I became as weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all men, that I might by all means save some.

Restoring Vision

- 1. Recognize the problem
- 2. Pray for help and wisdom
- 3. Seek intervention opportunities
 - New pastor
 - Church crisis
 - Evangelism conference
 - Plant a new church
- 4. Recreate the vision in others
 - Why are we here?
 - Where will our present course take us?
 - Is this where we want to go?
 - What must change with us to further Christ's mission?
- Strategies for change
 - Start with the leadership
 - Think in terms of both/and instead of either/or
 - Increase the number who own the mission
 - Help people discover and use their spiritual gifts
 - Focus on possibilities and opportunities
 - Concentrate effort where you have control
 - Encourage tolerance if not acceptance
 - Give people choices
 - Identify one mission-related area your church does well and focus on it
 - Keep reviewing the dream
